



## Research Traineeships

**Attention: Graduate students majoring in Biology, Chemistry, Geology, Geography, Mathematics, Environmental Studies, Chemical Engineering, Environmental Engineering and related disciplines.**

The US Environmental Protection Agency is sponsoring a research training program to provide qualified graduate students with a unique educational experience at a federal research laboratory. Each trainee will work with an EPA scientist and a faculty advisor on a personalized research project at the National Risk Management Research Laboratory (NRMRL) or the National Homeland Security Research Center (NHSRC), both located at the USEPA Breidenbach Research Facility in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Appointments will vary from one quarter up to one year and may be renewed depending on availability of funds and level of performance. Traineeships will be awarded based on a competitive review process. Awards include an annual stipend, research allowance and full tuition and range from about \$34,000 to \$40,000 per year depending on the qualifications and target degree of the student.
