



Research Traineeship

Attention: Graduate Students majoring in Biology, Geology, Geography, Mathematics, Environmental Studies, Chemical Engineering, Environmental Engineering and related disciplines.

The US Environmental Protection Agency is sponsoring a research training program to provide qualified graduate students with a unique educational experience at a federal research laboratory. Each trainee will work with an EPA scientist and a faculty advisor on a personalized research project at the EPA's National Risk Management Research Laboratory in Cincinnati (across from the UC campus).

Appointments will vary from one quarter up to one year and may be renewed depending on availability of funds and level of performance. **A monthly stipend for MS and PhD candidates will be \$1,500 and \$1,750 respectively, and an annual research training allowance of up to \$3,000 for MS and \$6,000 for PhD candidates is included.**
