

Application Criteria

Please read the following criteria before applying.

1. Applicants must be enrolled full-time in an engineering, science, mathematics, or education degree program at the University of Cincinnati during the period of the Fellowship.
2. Undergraduate applicants must have junior or senior standing by September 2002. Students who will have completed a bachelor's degree by August 2002 must apply to be a graduate fellow.
3. Undergraduate fellows must have a GPA of 3.3/4.0 to be accepted.
4. Graduate students can be at any point in their studies; however, preference will be given to those who can commit at least two years to the program and who are accepted into a doctoral program.
5. Although this program involves modern technologies, the successful applicant is not required to have research experience nor a computing background.
6. Although this program involves teaching, the successful applicant is not required to have previous teaching experience.
7. Applicants must possess: maturity, professionalism, a keen interest in enhancing secondary school science and math curricula and teaching, an ability to professionally interact with a variety of professionals and students of all ages, and an open-mindedness for multiple perspectives.
8. Women and minorities are highly encouraged to apply.
9. Fellows are prohibited from committing to other major employment concurrent with the fellowship.
10. According to NSF requirements, undergraduate student participants supported with NSF funds must be US citizens or permanent residents of the United States or its possessions.
11. Applicants must be fluent in English in order to interact with secondary school educators and students.
